ABSTRACT: Muscle weakness is one of the first recognized systemic consequences of COPD. It has significant consequences to these patients causing exercise intolerance, reduced health status, enhanced utilization of health care resources and reduced survival. The main causes are inactivity and systemic inflammation. Rehabilitation is a proper treatment for muscle weakness in COPD.
