



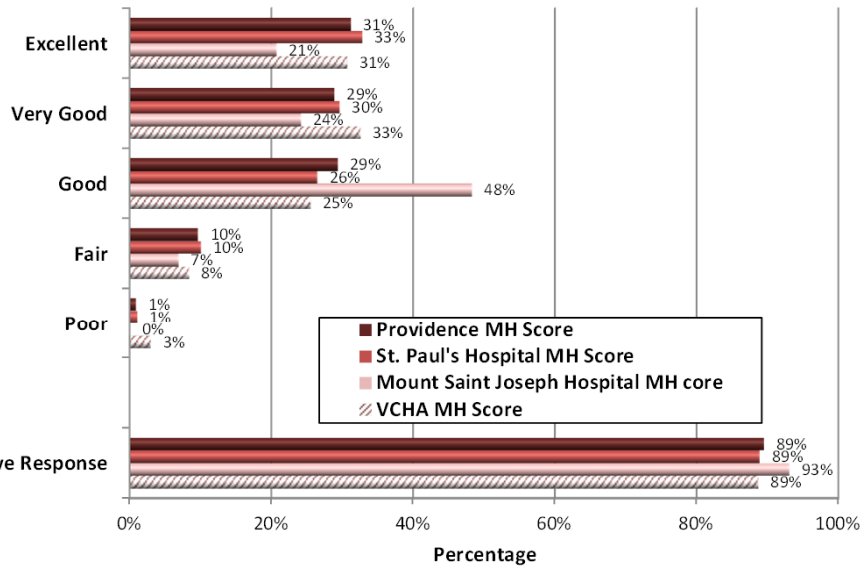

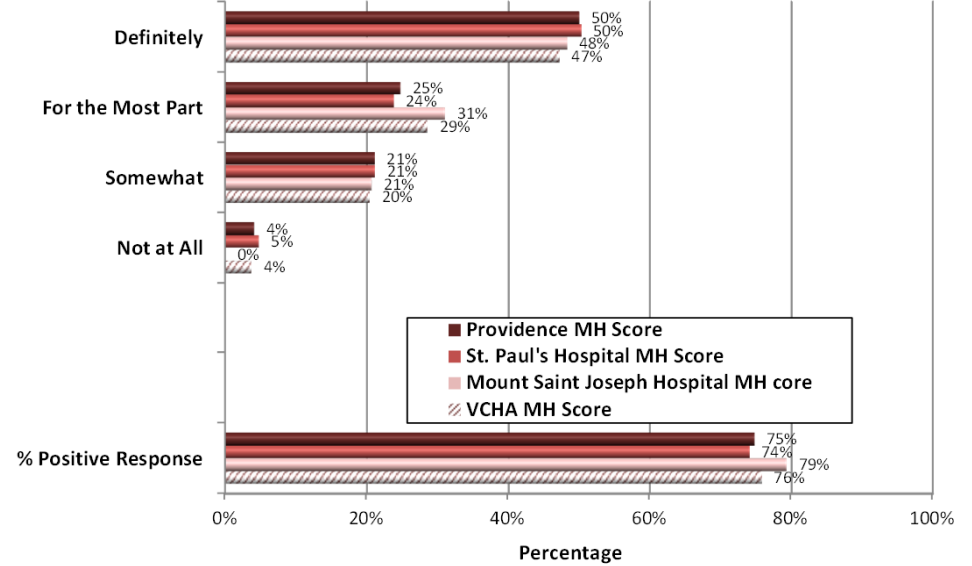
Report Date: October 17, 2011 Mental Health and Substance Use Patient/Client Experience of Care Survey:
