Dr. Wilson grew up in Prince George and earned his medical degree at UBC in 1979. Postgraduate training included an internship in Montreal and the GP anaesthesia program in Vancouver. He was a family physician in his home town from December, 1980, a practice that included anaesthesia, obstetrics, and 21 memorable New Years Eves in the Emergency.

Galt has served as Prince George Regional Hospital's Medical Director and Chief of Staff and was founding Director of both UBC's *Northern Family Medicine Residency Program* (1994-2004) and the Year III/IV Clinical Clerkship of the Northern Medical Program (2004-present). He earned an MSc in Medical Education (University of Calgary) in 2005 and was President of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of BC, 2005-07.

In September, 2009, Galt left clinical practice to become a Deputy Registrar with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of BC. His responsibilities include oversight of Clinical Performance concerns, the Prescription Review Program, eHealth, and the College Library.

Professional recognition has included the CFPC Canadian Family Physician of the Year (2000), PAR-BC Resident Advocate Award (1999), Wallace Wilson Leadership Award (UBC Medical Alumni—2008), David Bachop Medal for Distinguished Service (BCMA 2008), and Canadian Association for Medical Education Merit Award (2008).
