DESCRIPTION & OBJECTIVES

The goal of this course is to enable participants to identify and resolve ethical issues that arise in contemporary healthcare. Utilizing an interactive and case based approach and drawing on the expertise of an interdisciplinary faculty, participants will learn how to systematically address the multi-dimensional perspectives (i.e. patient, resident, family, practitioner, society) that are present in contemporary bioethical issues.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

At the end of this course, participants will be able to:

- Define, identify, and respond to ethical problems/dilemmas present in contemporary health care practice
- Utilize relevant resources to analyze and resolve bioethical and organizational problems
- Consider multi-dimensional perspectives (i.e. patient, resident, family, practitioner, society, culture) in bioethical issues
- Use of systematic approach to resolve bioethical dilemmas

TARGET AUDIENCE

Hospital and community-based physicians, midwives, dentists, nurses, allied health professionals, social services providers, health care leaders/executives, policy makers, pastoral care professionals, ethics committee members, and others who are interested in deepening their understanding of ethical reflection and engagement.
