### Skye Barbic, OT, PhD

Dr. Barbic is an Associate Professor in the Department of Occupational Science & Occupational Therapy (Faculty of Medicine) at UBC and a Canada Research Chair in Integrated Youth Services. Dr. Barbic is the Head Scientist at Foundry, a PHC and her research examines the assessment, services, treatments, and supports



for emerging adults with mental health problems or illnesses. Dr. Barbic's focus on early and timely intervention for youth mental health is reflective of PHC's goal of offering the right care, in the right place, at the right time.

### Lillian Hung, RN, PhD

Dr. Hung is an Associate Professor in the UBC School of Nursing and a Canada Research Chair in Senior Care. As founder and head of the UBC IDEA lab (Innovation in Dementia & Aging), Dr. Hung's research examines how technology and environment impact the care experiences of persons with dementia. Committed



to facilitating connection between academia and practice, Dr. Hung co-researches with people with dementia, family members, and interprofessional practitioners to find practical solutions to problems arising in the care setting.

## Workshop Facilitators Michelle Carter, RN, MSN

Michelle is a Clinical Nurse Specialist in the Mental Health Program at St. Paul's Hospital and a Doctoral student in the School of Nursing at the University of British Columbia. Her clinical experience informs her research, which aims to improve care access and mental



health outcomes through the development and implementation of pragmatic, evidence-based tools, interventions, and care models.

Dr. Wang is a Clinical Pharmacy Specialist in Cardiac Surgery at St. Paul's Hospital and a Clinical Assistant Professor with the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences at UBC. Dr. Wang was awarded a Health Professional-Investigator Award from Michael Smith

Health Research BC in 2024, and her research program aims to determine the safest and most efficacious blood thinner regimens after open heart or heart valve surgery.



### Sandra Lauck, RN, PhD

Dr. Lauck had a progressive career at PHC from staff nurse in critical care, to nurse educator and clinical nurse specialist in the Heart Centre prior to obtaining her PhD from the UBC School of Nursing. In 2017, she was appointed to the first

university-appointed and hospital-located clinical academic position. Sandra holds the St. Paul's Hospital Professorship in Cardiovascular Nursing at UBC, and has a dual appointment as an embedded nurse clinician-scientist at PHC and Associate Professor at the UBC School of Nursing. Dr. Lauck focuses on the delivery of health services, and on championing the role that nurses play in using and producing knowledge.



#### Becky Palmer, RN, PhD

Dr. Palmer is the Chief & Vice President of People, Nursing, and Health Professions at PHC. Dr. Palmer oversees an integrated portfolio of human resources, clinical informatics, and professional practice, navigating and innovating through
